

CONTACTING THE COLLEGE

If you have an Education Health & Care Plan, learning difficulty or disability we would encourage you to come and speak to us as soon as possible. As a general guide, the earlier you can do so the better. You can contact us:

1. AT SCHOOL

If you are at school, appointments can be made with us directly by you, or through your school.

2. DURING YOUR APPLICATION TO US

When you are filling in your application form, complete the section about 'Learning Support'. Your interviewer or a member of the Learning Support team will then be able to discuss your support needs. You can bring someone along with you to the interview - we often have parents, friends or teachers attending with future students. In some instances our staff may contact you before the interview or ask to meet with you again after the interview.

3. AT COLLEGE

At whatever stage you talk to us we will try to match your individual needs with the appropriate level and type of support.

We actively encourage our learners to disclose any support they feel they need as this can help us provide tailor-made learning that fits the needs of the individual.

We respect your right to confidentiality about your disability. Once you have made us aware of your disability and have agreed that information can be passed on, we will ensure that your information is only shared with relevant members of staff. We will ask you to complete a Personal Disclosure Form for this purpose and this form will be in your enrolment pack.

HOW TO APPLY

FULL-TIME

Complete an application form, available online for your chosen course and fill in the section headed 'Learning Support'.

Once you have applied our Admissions team will arrange an interview date for you. It helps to let us know if you will need specific interview arrangements, for instance having a signer present, so we can arrange this in plenty of time.

If you would like to meet with us informally before your interview, we can arrange this for you. All you have to do is contact the Specialist Administrator for ALS on 01279 868210.

PART-TIME

Contact our Admissions Advisers directly. You will need to make them aware that you need additional support for your learning.

We will then contact you to discuss, and agree, the best and most appropriate way to meet your needs.

AN ALTERNATIVE TO SPECIALIST SCHOOLS

Sometimes we are asked for information when a student wants to go to a specialist college and needs to know if Harlow College can provide a suitable alternative. We will always invite you for a discussion and give you an honest assessment of our capability to meet your needs. We work closely with Local Education Authorities (LEAs), schools and the Children & Young People with Disabilities Service to help students, parents and others make the best decision for a prospective student, including those with an Education, Health and Care Plan.



SUPPORT AVAILABLE

The Learning Support Department:

- Offers advice and can assess the level of support you will need before you join the College, and whether we will be able to provide it to the necessary standard to enable your progression
- Arranges for specialist equipment, support and aids to be available (this may be subject to additional funding in some instances)
- Makes applications for access arrangements to be in place for examinations
- Co-ordinates the provision of classroom support, such as signing, note-taking and help with practical activities
- Liaises with other tutors and staff to ensure your learning needs are met and that you are able to work towards your Academic and your Preparation for Adulthood goals

EXAMS & ASSESSMENTS

We can provide help for exams and assessments. The Learning Support Team will arrange any special reports required by the Exam Boards to ensure that you have the correct access arrangements in place.

We can also help in emergencies, such as a student being taken seriously ill or having a short-term problem like breaking their writing hand.

Provision might include:

Extra time for written tests if you have a specific learning difficulty like dyslexia

Specially printed or enlarged papers

A reader or writer

A private room

Extra breaks in exams if your medical condition means you need to take periods of rest

A communicator or BSL interpreter for assessments


