

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT: August 2023 – July 2024

This document should be read by all existing and prospective students. As a student, by accepting and taking up your place with Harlow College you are agreeing to abide by this Code of Conduct.

During the induction process you will be asked to confirm you have read and understood this document as part of the College induction process. Discuss with your Personal Development Coach (or Teacher if you are part-time) any changes or circumstances that affect your study or attendance.

Studying with Harlow College you are required to abide by, and support, the Student Code of Conduct at all times as set out below, failure to do so could evoke the use of our Disciplinary Policy or other policies and may result in a sanction being applied (related policies noted at the end of this document):

Attendance and Punctuality

- ✓ Maintain a minimum of 90% attendance for any face to face delivery
- ✓ Maintain a minimum of 90% engagement for any online learning
- ✓ Arrive on time for all classes, ready to learn (Face to face or virtual)
- ✓ Discuss with your Personal Development Coach (or Teacher or Tutor if you are part-time) any changes or circumstances that affect your study or attendance

Behaviour

- ✓ Follow all safety instructions you are given, this may include any future public health instructions e.g. Social Distancing, washing your hands and or using a sanitiser
- ✓ Wear your Harlow College ID and colour coded lanyard at all times when onsite
- ✓ If instructed to do so for safety reasons, stay within the your lanyard coloured zone on campus
- ✓ Maintain good behaviour at all times, ensuring that your behaviour or actions do not bring the College into disrepute at any time, even when not on College premises or on a College activity
- ✓ Abide by the mobile phone statement
- ✓ Bring into College the full equipment that you need to support your study only
- ✓ Don't bring onto campus item(s) that might cause concern, harm to yourself or others, or offence to others
- ✓ Avoid foul or abusive language anywhere on the campus
- ✓ Treat all others with respect whatever their age, race, gender, sexual orientation, disability, level of ability, religion, culture or ethnic background. Peer on Peer/child on child abuse and harmful sexual behaviour, including on-line abuse and explicit images will not be tolerated.
- ✓ Look after your College environment and the facilities
- ✓ We are a non-smoking and non-vaping campus, please do not smoke or vape anywhere in College or whilst on our campuses
- ✓ Do not bring alcohol or illegal drugs into the College or attend College under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs (please inform your teacher of any prescription drugs that may affect your behaviour)

Academic Performance

- ✓ Bring the right learning materials (i.e. any PPE or a charged iPad)
- ✓ Work hard to make learning successful for yourself and others in your group
- ✓ If you are behind with work, make every effort to catch up and attend workshop sessions
- ✓ Complete all your assignments in line with the brief given to you, and hand them in on time

Academic Misconduct

- ✓ Make sure all coursework submitted is your own work
- ✓ Abide by the regulations of the relevant examining body for your qualification
- ✓ Ensure your work is appropriately referenced

Health and Wellbeing

- ✓ Certain behaviours may impact your future career; consider carefully how you behave at all times
- ✓ Ensure that you maintain a healthy lifestyle that supports your chosen career
- ✓ Follow the College's guidance on being safe on-line
