

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT V2 – June 2020 (to be reviewed annually)

This document should be read by all existing and prospective students. As a student, by accepting and taking up your place at Harlow College you are agreeing to abide by this Code of Conduct. During the induction process you will be asked to confirm you have read and understood this document as part of the college induction process.

Discuss with your Learning Mentor (or Teacher if you are part-time) any changes or circumstances that affect your study or attendance.

Studying at Harlow College you are required to abide by and support the Student Code of Conduct at all times as set out below, failure to do so could evoke the use of our Disciplinary Policy or other polices and may result in an sanction being applied (related polices noted at the end of this document):

Attendance and Punctuality

- ✓ Maintain a minimum of 90% attendance for any face to face delivery
- ✓ Maintain a minimum of 90% engagement for any online learning
- ✓ Arrive on time for all classes, ready to learn (Face to face or virtual)
- ✓ Discuss with your Learning Mentor (or Tutor if you are part-time) any changes or circumstances that affect your study or attendance

Behaviour

- ✓ Follow all safety instructions you are given, this includes the strict rules around Social Distancing, washing your hands and or using sanitiser
- ✓ Wear your Harlow College ID and colour coded lanyard at all times when onsite
- ✓ Stay within your colour coded zone unless you have permission to move across a zone
- ✓ Maintain good behaviour at all times, ensuring that your behaviour or actions do not bring the college into disrepute at any time, even when not on college premises or on a college activity
- ✓ Abide by the mobile phone statement
- ✓ Bring into college the full equipment that you need to support your study only

- ✓ Look after your college environment and the facilities
- ✓ We are a non-smoking and vaping campus, please do not smoke or vape anywhere in college or whilst on our campus
- ✓ Do not bring alcohol or illegal drugs into the college or attend college under the influence of alcohol and illegal drugs (please inform your tutor of any prescription drugs that may affect your behaviour)
- ✓ Due to Covid 19 please keep yourself and others safe by not sharing food and drink, equipment or PPE

- ✓ Bring the right learning materials (i.e. any PPE or a charged iPad)
- ✓ Work hard to make learning successful for yourself and others in your group
- ✓ If you are behind with work, make every effort to catch up and attend workshop sessions
- ✓ Complete all your assignments in line with the brief given to you, and hand them in on time

Academic Misconduct

- ✓ Make sure all coursework submitted is your own
- ✓ Abide by the regulations of the relevant examining body for your qualification
- ✓ Ensure your work is appropriately referenced

Health and Wellbeing

- ✓ Considering Covid 19 health and safety ensure you keep yourself safe, this will in turn keep others safe
- ✓ Certain behaviours may impact your future career; consider carefully how you behave at all times
- ✓ Ensure that you maintain a healthy lifestyle that supports your chosen career
- ✓ Follow the College's guidance on being safe online
