

BE SAFE!



You have the right to be and feel safe from all forms of abuse.



CHILD ON CHILD SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND ABUSE

No one should touch you in a manner that makes you feel uncomfortable or upset. No one should make suggestive, sexual remarks to you, either in-person or online. Anyone under 18 is legally a child.



PHYSICAL ABUSE

No one should touch you in any way that physically hurts. This could include hitting, pushing, slapping, kicking or holding you back.



RADICALISATION

No one should try to recruit you into joining an extremist group of any kind.



HONOUR-BASED ABUSE

No one should force you to marry against your wishes or to become a victim of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM).



CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

Anyone under the age of 18 is a child under the law. No one should encourage or force you to take part in sexual activities against your wishes for rewards e.g. money, gifts etc. either in-person or online.



BULLYING

No one should make you feel scared. They should not make you do anything that you do not want to do, either in person or electronically (e.g. text, email, social media etc).



DISCRIMINATION

No one should be treated badly because of difference in age, disability, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation or religion. Difference should be respected.



MODERN DAY SLAVERY

Are you or is someone you know being exploited - "owned" - by another person or group?



DOMESTIC ABUSE

No one should harm threaten or control you. This includes family, other people you live with or partner/ex partner.



NEGLECT

Whoever looks after you should not neglect you. You should know that you are cared for.



COUNTY LINES

Are you or is someone you know carrying drugs or delivering packages? Are you or is someone you know being threatened to carry out criminal activity?
