IMPORTANT APPRENTICESHIP ANOUNCEMENT

From 1 August the UK Government has increased the payments made to employers when employing a new apprentice. These arrangements also affect the way employers make arrangements to employ the new apprentice and also to engage with training provides such as Harlow College.

Employers may still use Harlow College to help recruit a new apprentice and this service remains FREE OF CHARGE. However, you will now need to first register as a business with the **Apprenticeship Service** and also reserve funding for apprentice training. The process is straightforward, and we are always available to help.

It is very important you register, as the additional incentive payment(s) offered by ESFA will only be paid if you have registered before hiring an apprentice.

IMPORTANT: You must also select Harlow College as your nominated training provider partner for the training you wish the apprentice to receive.

INCENTIVE PAYMENTS FOR HIRING A NEW APPRENTICE (COVID19)

When you hire new apprentices between 1 August 2020 and 31 January 2021, you can apply for extra funding as below:

For apprentices aged:

- 16 to 24, you'll receive £2,000
- over 25, you'll receive £1,500

The payment is in addition to the existing £1,000 employers receive when taking on a new apprentice who is:

- aged 16 to 18 years old
- under 25 and has an education, health and care plan or has been in the care of their local authority

Also: You could get the incentive payment when you hire an <u>apprentice who's been made</u> <u>redundant</u>, as long as they're new to your organisation.
